Hope on the Streets: Stories of Survival from the Frontlines of Rescue

We've seen the aftermath of brutal road accidents—dogs left lying in agony on highways and busy intersections, some with broken bones, crushed limbs, and severe internal injuries. Many were unconscious, bleeding, and barely clinging to life when our team reached them. In several cases, life-saving surgeries were carried out within hours of rescue—amputations, bone plating, and emergency treatments that gave them a second chance.

Alongside these accidents, we've also responded to distressing cruelty cases. Beaten, burned, or deliberately injured, these animals were found with deep wounds, swollen faces, and signs of prolonged abuse. Some were abandoned after falling ill, left without food or shelter, struggling to survive in harsh conditions. The visible wounds tell only part of their story—the invisible trauma often takes far longer to heal.









Each of the dogs you see in these photos has fought a battle. They've endured physical pain, emotional trauma, and in many cases, complete abandonment. But thanks to quick action, compassionate care, and support from people like you, they now have a safe space to recover–free from fear, hunger, and harm.

Our shelter is now home to over 80 such animals, each requiring daily treatment, nutritious food, and emotional rehabilitation. These rescues remind us of the urgent need for compassion–not just in moments of crisis, but in everyday life. They show us that while cruelty still exists, so does kindness.

But we cannot do this alone.

Every treatment, every surgery, every meal is possible only because of your support. With rising medical and operational costs, we are depending more than ever on your generosity to continue this life-saving work.

As you turn these pages, let these faces remind you: your help heals. Your support saves. Your kindness gives them a second chance.

A Voice for the Voiceless: Animal Care Team Joins Protest at Jantar Mantar

On April 20th, at 12 PM, the Animal Care Team joined a powerful gathering of animal lovers, volunteers, and welfare organizations at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi, to raise our collective voice against the unlawful relocation of community dogs.

This was not just a demonstration—it was a heartfelt appeal to protect the most vulnerable beings in our urban landscape. Over the past few weeks, there has been a troubling surge in the forceful removal of street dogs from their home territories across Delhi. These dogs, many of whom are sterilized, vaccinated, and lovingly cared for by feeders, have been taken away without warning or accountability. Some have vanished entirely.

The Animal Birth Control (ABC) Rules 2023, laid down by the Animal Welfare Board of India, clearly state that sterilized and vaccinated dogs must be returned to the same area they were picked up from. These rules are in place not only to protect the dogs but also to ensure public health through proper management of the street dog population. Sadly, these laws are being overlooked, and our community dogs are paying the price.

At the protest, our team stood in solidarity with hundreds of concerned citizens to demand an immediate halt to these illegal actions. We held placards, shared stories, and reminded everyone that these dogs are not just "strays"—they are part of our neighborhoods, our ecosystem, and our hearts.

Every day, we care for dogs who rely on specific territories for their survival. When they are removed, they lose their shelter, their feeding points, their sense of safety. Many do not survive the ordeal. The pain and disorientation they suffer is immense, and entirely preventable.

We believe that humane, lawful solutions must be implemented with compassion and cooperation—not cruelty and secrecy. Enforcement of ABC protocols, support for local feeders, and community awareness are the real answers—not relocation.

Our presence at Jantar Mantar on April 20th was a reflection of our mission—to be the voice for the voiceless. We thank every individual who joined us, in person or in spirit, for making this stand matter. It is only through unity and persistence that real change becomes possible.

This protest was a beginning. And we are far from finished.
